WHAT IS NO SWEAT?

No Sweat is the UK campaign for workers' solidarity against sweatshop labour, low-pay and hyper exploitation. We believe that all workers should be entitled to:

- **Living wages**
- **Safety at work**
- **The right to join or form independent trade unions.**

Our campaigning includes fundraising for workers' struggles, street stunts to expose sweatshop brands and employers, direct action targeting particular companies, as well as putting on informational meetings to raise awareness of workers' struggles in the UK and abroad. We also run monthly music nights in London to raise money to support our campaigning activities.

We do not see consumer-focused campaigns such as boycotts as integral; we concentrate on building direct support and solidarity for workers and their organisations. The frontline of the struggle is on the factory floor, not on our shopping lists!

We have been involved in campaigns to support workers' struggles in China, Haiti, Iraq, Iran, Argentina, Mexico, Indonesia and New Zealand as well as right here in Britain.
