## How Unethical is the Gap?

The Gap, which also owns Banana Republic and Old Navy, *claims* to be socially responsible. So why is it outsourcing to unethical contractors? Last October, news broke that some Gap clothes were being made in a sweatshop in India by children 10 to 13 years old in conditions "close to slavery."



Now the company that transports Gap merchandise—Oak Harbor Freight Lines—has provoked an unfair labor practice strike by violating federal law. Gap's shipping company also wants to eliminate retirees' health insurance, freeze employees' pensions, and slash sick leave.

Gap contractors shouldn't be hurting kids in India or the elderly in America. Tell the manager inside this store: The Gap needs to live up to its ethical standards and make its contractors do the same.
